Weekly Family-Guardian Communication

...from the Interdisciplinary Care Team 9/18/20

In our effort to maintain open and honest communication, we will continue to send you updates when appropriate concerning all Respiratory Viral Outbreaks as well as The Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19). We hope you find this information helpful.

Resident Update

All of our Residents are well. Two Residents were tested for COVID-19 due to symptoms and both have tested negative.

Staff Update

We have four Staff Members (direct caregivers) that have tested positive via our weekly testing. The Staff Members did not have any signs or symptoms of illness. All remain home, self-isolating for 14 days. We have three Staff Members under investigation due to symptoms. All have been tested for COVID-19. Two results are negative and one is pending. The Staff Members did not provide care to any of the Residents when ill.

Resident/Staff COVID-19 Testing

Following The NJ Department of Health (NJ DOH) guidance and due to our outbreak status, weekly testing of all Residents and Staff continues. We are completing our 12th week of testing. So far, all of our Residents have tested negative. This will continue until the NJ DOH declares our outbreak is over. We will keep you updated.

Visitation

The NJ DOH issued Executive Directive No. 20-025 permitting **indoor** visitation for Pediatric Residents following strict guidelines. Our target date to start is further delayed due to our outbreak status. The Directive requires us to be COVID-19 and/or respiratory virus free for 28 days to permit indoor visitation. We will inform you as soon as we are permitted to begin indoor visitation. In the meantime, Outdoor Visitation continues, weather permitting. Please contact your Child's Social Worker or Nursing Supervisor to arrange a visit. Video visitation is also available via Skype, Zoom or Facetime. We encourage you to contact your VPF Social Worker to help arrange this.

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Phased Reopening

Recently, The NJ DOH issued Executive Directive No. 20-026 establishing mandatory procedures that long term care facilities must meet in order to safely reopen to all visitors and resume normal operations. The phased reopening is based on the outbreak status of a facility, its ability to meet criteria, including but not limited to testing of Staff and Residents, infection control standards, and adequate Staffing and Personnel Protective Equipment (PPE) following the State's reopening plan. When facilities are outbreak free, they may restore services for Residents, in phases, starting with indoor visitation and the restart of normal activities. Since we are in an outbreak, we cannot move forward. We must be COVID and/or Respiratory Virus free for a period of 28 days **and** be cleared from The NJ DOH to proceed with the phases outlined for a safe reopening.

Our Commitment

Resident and Staff wellness and safety is our top priority. Please be reassured we continue to follow all necessary Infection Prevention and Infection Control measures partnering with the NJ DOH to maintain our current state of wellness. Our commitment to wellness has been verified - we had an unannounced visit, an Infection Prevention and Control focused Survey, on 9/9 by the NJ DOH. We are happy to report that we were found to be in full compliance with all of the federal and state rules, guidelines and standards of care specific to Infection Prevention and Control. There were no concerns raised by The NJ DOH about our practices during this Survey.
